


Women's Ministry Report

The Ladies Morning Bible Study group decided to meet every week this fall. The group had traditionally met every other week, but we thought we would try weekly and it has been good.

We finished studying Acts and then in the spring we went through a video series "The Rock, the Road and the Rabbi". We studied the book of Daniel this fall. During Advent, we looked at prophecy of the first coming of Christ. We are now studying Paul's prison letters, beginning with Ephesians. We will continue working our way through Paul's letters. We use some of the material found on Gary Hamrick's website "Cornerstone Chapel" and sometimes we just do our own thing. We have been working on some methods to study the Bible that we can use to dig into the Word for ourselves. These women are very eager Bible scholars, and we have great discussions with lots of input.

There have been a few other activities for women this year. We had a Bannock baking afternoon that was very well attended and delicious! There was a watercolour painting evening which was also great. Even those of us with zero talent made some nice pictures. We had a Valentine making afternoon in February to help get Valentines to the people in care homes in Weyburn. Outreach events for the ladies to get to know each other would be a good so any ideas are welcome.

Pastor Matt set up a WhatsApp group for the Women's Ministry. This has been a great tool for the ladies of the church to communicate information as well as share thoughts and prayer needs. We have also set up meals for some of the people in our church through the Meal Train App which has been a good way to support someone in a difficult time of their lives.

There has been an interest in an evening group of Ladies Bible study. When Alpha is done, we will be exploring what that may look like.

Kids' Ministry Report

As we reflect on 2025, I want to thank our church family for your support of Life Centre's ministry to children this past year. We have continued with a nursery and two kids' classes, and we have held some fun kid-focused events this year.

Our nursery provided space for kids under 3 to play, with a TV showing the livestream of the service for their caregivers. Our two kids' classes ran each Sunday morning during the sermon portion of the service, with one class for ages 3 to Grade 1, and one class for Grades 2 to 6. We started the year using curriculums from Purposeful Design and Teach Sunday School. After spending a lot of time over the summer looking at various other curriculums, in the fall we switched to Two or More by Group Publishing. Both classes focus on the same topic each week, but with a lesson and activities that are at their level.

A huge thank you goes out to those who taught alongside me in 2025: Gary Erickson, Anne Fox, Kirsty Frayn, Chrystina Gimson, Karen Gimson, Hannah Mercer, Dennice Rouse, and Le Anne Welburn. We had a team of fantastic helpers as well: Tahaira Beyer, Natalie Brackpool, Anita Douglas, Zach Mallari, Levi Mitchell, and Keanan Palomares.

That may sound like a long list, but we would love to add a few more teachers and helpers. While the younger class has been averaging 8 to 10 children per week, the Grade 2-6 class regularly has 16+ children. This is more than we can comfortably fit in the room! (This is about how many children we had in total in 2023, when we split from one to two classes.) We'd love to add a third class upstairs, to have age 3 to Kindergarten, Grades 1-3, and Grades 4-6. Please consider whether you could volunteer once or twice a month!

Kids' Ministry Report

In 2025, we continued with a few of the same events we began the previous year. In July, we had a School's Out for Summer party in our church parking lot, with bouncers, games, and hot dogs. In August, we hosted a weeklong Bible day camp with a team from Devoted Ministries, where kids took part in crafts, games, songs, and Bible lessons. In December, the children rehearsed a short Christmas play to present to our church family. We had a Noon Year's Eve party on Dec. 31st. Kids enjoyed various stations throughout our building, and at noon we celebrated with a countdown and a balloon drop.

I am so thankful for the support from our Life Centre family in ministering to our children and reaching out to our community. Whether it is committing to be involved regularly or stepping up to help out for a special event, your contributions make a difference. I have been honoured to be entrusted with the leadership of our kids' ministry, and I am grateful to raise my own children in a church family that values them and invests in them.

As I pass this role onto Kirsty Frayn, I can't wait to see how God will work in the hearts and lives of our children in 2026!

This means that every year our youth will be learning a balance of Old Testament study, New Testament study, spiritual disciplines, practical life and relationship guidance, and more. We believe that this will help make more fully-formed disciples, as we now have a better long-term map to teach (and discuss) a wider variety of topics.

It has been exciting to see some of the youth poke their heads in on a Sunday morning! Particularly meaningful to me is when their parents come with them! I am praying that we can do more in the coming year to help bridge the gap between the youth group on Friday and the church service on Sunday.

Heading into 2026, we are excited to be handing over leadership to Kirsty Frayn, as she gives overall leadership to our "next gen" ministries. Please pray for her as she gets to know the students and grows in her ability to lead youth evenings and our team.

I also want to thank our ever-growing youth ministry team. Fuel and Kat, Darren, Lukas, Wayne and Kirsty, Adam, and Jen. We are always looking to find the right adults to be present and build relationships with the students who come. So if you are interested, please speak to Kirsty or myself.

Let me once again call for everyone committed to Life Centre and to Jesus to do two things:


- 1) Pray that God would continue to draw people to Himself.
